

# JMU/nTelos Sports Network

James Madison University's entire 2010-11 men's basketball schedule will be broadcast by the JMU/nTelos Sports Network. Front Row Marketing manages the network in cooperation with JMU. WSVA-AM in Harrisonburg of the Ver Standig Broadcast Group serves as the network's flagship station.

Mike Schikman and Curt Dudley serve as network commentators. Schikman (play-by-play) returned to a game-site position with the network in 1991. He previously was a network commentator from 1981-86, and he handled the network's in-station broadcast responsibilities in 1989 and 1990. Dudley, director of multimedia communications for JMU's Department of Intercollegiate Athletics, handles color commentary during road games and coordinates network operations. He has done JMU/nTelos Sports Network broadcasts at various times since joining the JMU staff in 1988.



Dudley, a Norfolk, Va. native, is a 1983 Bridgewater College graduate, and he previously worked on scholastic broadcasts for WSVA.

WSVA's 5,000-watt signal broadcasts to listeners in the Shenandoah Valley area. Network affiliates currently include either ESPN-WGH or 94.1 FM in Hampton Roads, and WWWR Fox Radio 910 in Roanoke. All games also have free audio broadcasts

on MadiZONE on JMUSports.com along with subscriber video for

home games and select away games on MadiZONE.






# MEDIA GUIDELINES



The 2010-11 James Madison University men's basketball media guide is designed to assist the media with its coverage of James Madison men's basketball. Additional information, statistics and photographs may be acquired by contacting Kevin Warner in the James Madison Athletics Communications Office, MSC 0404, 380 University Boulevard, Harrisonburg, VA, 22807.

### **Press Credentials**

Requests for working press space must be made in writing at least one week before the date of the home contest to the James Madison Athletics Communications Office. The request should be made in writing via e-mail by the sports director of the newspaper, magazine, radio or television outlet wishing to send reporter(s) and/or photographer(s) to the game. Confirmation of the request will be made by James Madison Athletics Communications personnel. Press credentials WILL NOT be issued to spouses, friends or children, in accordance with the working code of the College Sports Information Directors of America. Press row is a working area and cheering will be grounds for removal.

# **Photographers**

Photographers are issued similar credentials to press row media. Due to HIPAA regulations, we ask all photographers, both television and print, not to photograph any injury evaluations done in the bench/sidelines area. Additionally, per the credential policy, there is no reselling of game photos taken by media members without the express written agreement from James Madison University.

# **Parking**

Parking for members of the media is available at the Convocation Center in Lot D. Requests for parking should be made in advance to allow for mailing.



## **Entering the Convocation Center**

Press credentials can be picked up in the James Madison Athletics Communications Office beginning two days prior to games and until noon for weekday home games. . If credentials are requested and approved, they will only be mailed if the request is granted at least two weeks prior to game. Any credentials not picked up in advance from office will be left at the Will Call window at the Convocation Center door D.

### Radio

James Madison football can be heard live on the JMU Sports Network and on the Internet at www.JMUSports.com.

# **Visiting Radio**

Accomodations for visiting radio stations will be available for all games on press row on the opposite side from both team benches. Visitors receive one reciprocal phone line for their game broadcasts. Should more lines be needed or for access to ISDN lines, please contact Kevin Warner for arrangements. ISDN requests must be made at least two weeks prior to the game.

### **Media Information**

The James Madison Athletics Communications staff will provide game programs, flip cards, game notes and updated cumulative statistics for both teams to credentialed media prior to all games. Statistical summaries and play-by-play sheets will be distributed throughout the game and will be available at the conclusion of the contest.

Media members will be provided with a pre-game meal at least an hour prior to the game, while water and soft drinks will be available throughout the game.

## **Interview Policy (Game Day)**

James Madison's post-game interviews will be conducted in the Duke Club Room near Door C and the visiting locker room. Both head coaches will be available to the media after the NCAA-mandated 10-minute cooling-off period, with the visiting team going first, followed by JMU players with Head Coach Matt Brady going last. The James Madison locker room is closed to the media, so please see a member of the athletics communications/sports information staff from either James Madison or the visiting institution regarding postgame player interview requests.

### **Telephone/Internet Access**

If media are in need of a phone line for the game or season, please inform Kevin Warner at time of credential request of those needs. For those media that can file over the World Wide Web with laptop computers that can automatically select an IP address, there are hardwire Internet connections as well as wireless access available along press row.

## **Interview Policy (Mid-Week)**

Head Coach Matt Brady is available to speak to the media via phone Monday-Thursday mornings. Presented by Ham's Restaurant, Coach Brady's weekly media luncheons will be held Mondays at noon at Ham's on University Boulevard and streamed on delay on JMUSports.com.

Individual players are available for interviews Monday-Wednesday. ALL player and coach interviews must be cleared through the James Madison Athletics Communications Office at least 24 hours in advance. This policy allows us to arrange a time that will not interfere with a student-athlete's academic schedule, which has top priority. One note to the media: Home phone numbers for players and coaches WILL NOT be given out by the James Madison Athletics Communications Office.



# 2010-11 OUTLOOK



Spend any significant amount of time around the James Madison University Convocation Center prior to the 2010-11 men's basketball season and one will hear two words bantered around more than any others, cautious optimism.

Head coach Matt Brady enters his third campaign with the Dukes having experienced both the ups and downs. His first season in 2008-09 produced 20 wins (21-15) and the program's first winning record in nine years. The 2009-10 season was also looking promising in preseason, however injuries derailed much of the potential before the season really hit its stride.

Fast forward to 2010 and, so far, a healthy roster, an influx of talent and a renewed team chemistry have everyone optimistic that the program is headed in the right direction.



"There's a feeling of cautious optimism," said Brady. "The players feel the same way, but a bit more aggressively optimistic. I think in year three, the level of talent has significantly enhanced. The players we have now are certainly talented enough, if it all works out, to challenge the upper third of this league, and have success in March."

### **LOOKING BACK**

During the 2009-10 preseason, the program was coming off its first winning season in nine years and its first postseason competition in 25 years. Expectations were high that the accomplishments of the previous year would be built upon in the coming season with the hopes that the pieces were in place to contend for the CAA title with four starters returning and the addition of a big-time paint presence in transfer Denzel Bowles.

However, before the season even began, those hopes took a major hit as starting point guard Devon Moore, a CAA All-Rookie selection the year before, went down with a season-ending injury just four days prior to the season tipoff in his hometown at Ohio State.

Just two weeks later, returning forward Andrey Semenov suffered from a spell of severe back issues that derailed his season after just four games. Along with those two key losses, Bowles was not eligible for the first seven games due to his transfer and forward Dazzmond Thornton was unavailable for any of the second-semester games. That put the lineup into shuffle mode and made the Dukes short on depth.

The team got off to a respectable 6-4 start before the rigors of CAA play set in and JMU went just 7-16 the rest of the way, 4-14 in the league.

Despite the struggles and the depth issues, the Dukes did recover to defeat Drexel in the opening round of the CAA Tournament. JMU also led eventual runner-up William and Mary in the quarterfinals by 14 points early in the second half before succumbing to a late rally by the Tribe.

Among the season highlights, senior guard Pierre Curtis shifted to the point guard position from the two-guard spot he filled as a junior. He ranked top five in the league in assists (4.2 per game) and assists-to-turnover ratio (1.9). He left JMU with his name scattered all over the career charts, holding program records for minutes (4,137), games (126), starts (124), assists (124), and steals (175) while also ranking 16th in career points with 1,237.

Bowles, still relatively inexperienced from his limited action at Texas A&M, responded to lofty expectations quickly, posting 37 points in just his second game of eligibility at Gardner-Webb. He went on to become the first player in CAA history to lead the league in scoring (20.8 points/game), rebounding (9.2/game) and field-goal percentage (.594), earning him Second Team All-CAA honors. His 12 scoring/rebounding double-doubles in just 25 games already ranks third in JMU history.

Sophomore forward Julius Wells, the reigning CAA Rookie of the Year, was pressed into a higher-scoring role with the absence of other players and responded by earning Third Team All-CAA honors and ranking among the top five in the league with 16.3 points/game. He established JMU sophomore class records for three-pointers (91), minutes (1,211), points (539), field-goal attempts (470), and three-point attempts (258).

### **LOOKING AHEAD**

Despite an 11th-place finish in the CAA a year ago, optimism has still surfaced as the key word for the Dukes thanks to the healthy returns of Moore and Semenov, the CAA Player of the Year potential for Bowles, the shooting ability of Wells, and an influx of seven talented newcomers, including four transfers. That optimism, however, will remain cautious as the Dukes attempt to navigate the schedule without significant injuries for the first time in Brady's three seasons.

Should significant injuries surface again, Brady feels the Dukes are in much better position to handle the adversity with perhaps the most depth that the program has had in a decade. He said, "There's a chance that two of our starters from a year ago could become substitutes. That's saying something about our depth. The three eligible transfers and Chad [Jackson] are really good players. They have a chance to be as good as any player in the league at their positions. I'm optimistic about our depth, but I also think the quality of the player in our program is significantly different."

In addition to depth, the strength of the team appears to be scoring potential with two of

the league's top five scorers returning in Bowles and Wells, one of the league's top distributors and crunch-time performers in Moore, a crowd of options to rotate through the wing positions, and a significant addition in the paint to take pressure off Bowles in the form of transfer Rayshawn Goins.

"Offensively we're very good if we're healthy," according to Brady. "We have arguably the best point guard, best center, and best outside shooter in the league in Devon, Denzel, and Julius. I think the other guys that have had experience at JMU are going to be helpful, and the new guys are terrific players. It's a team that will shoot the ball better, a team that is much more offensively gifted, and possesses more depth."


While offensive potential ranks as the biggest strength, the largest deficiencies appear to be the defense and collective winning experience. Of the defense, Brady said, "The only goal that we've really set as a team this year is to be one of the best teams defensively. We recognize that to be a champion-ship-level team, we need to play defense every day as if our season will rely on it. We're talking about intensity and effort more than anything else.

"Beyond that, the weakness of this team as a whole is that they have not won together. Denzel has not played a college basketball game with Devon or with Andrey, not to mention all of the new guys to add to the mix. There's a sense that we haven't accomplished anything yet, and not accomplishing our goals creates uncertainty."

### **PLAYERS**

Overall the Dukes return seven of 13 lettermen from a year ago while welcoming seven newcomers, including four transfers, each with two remaining years of eligibility.

The veteran of the group is senior guard Ben Louis, the lone remaining player not originally recruited by Brady. He provides versatility at the guard spot with the ability to fill any of the three perimeter positions after appearing in all 33 games a year ago with 21 starts. He averaged 5.4 points per game while also ranking second on the team with 82 assists. Louis has already demonstrated his

ability in clutch situations, nailing a baseline threepointer as time expired to clinch a home win over Towson last year.

"I think Ben's greatest strength is his incredible IQ. He's helped this program since he's been here with his IQ, and it's a role that's not going to change. He's a terrific basketball player, and he's going to have his moments this year where he helps us win games."

Perhaps no player enters the year with a higher ceiling and loftier expectations than senior forward

Denzel Bowles. He returns as a legitimate Player of the Year candidate and has appeared on the radar of NBA scouts for next summer's NBA Draft, thanks in large part to his participation at the Amare Stoudemire Skills Academy over the summer.

In addition to leading the league in points (20.8/game), rebounds (9.2/game) and field-goal percentage (.594), Bowles also blocked 36 shots and showed an impressive ability to distribute the basketball for a big man, compiling 62 assists. However, with just 42 career games under his belt, there remains a sense that Bowles still hasn't maximized his potential.

"There's clearly not a more talented, focal player in the league than Denzel. He recognizes that he needs to perform much better defensively. My concern with Denzel is can he do it day in and day out? Is he going to take last year for granted? He had a tremendous year and he thinks that's going to happen all over again. That's our fear as a staff. Offensively he's dynamite. He can pass. He can score the ball. His greatest improvement is showing more consistency as a face-up shooter."

The plethora of injuries and the lack of depth may have had the biggest impact last year on junior forward Julius Wells. While his scoring average (16.3/game) ranked among the best in the league, his attempts also skyrocketed thanks to the burden to produce points and lack of other significant scoring options. That showed in his percentages, .387 from the field and .353 from the three-point arc.

Wells may benefit the most from the improved depth with a likely reduction in total shots but an increase in quality of shots. Brady added, "Statistically, I don't know if he's going to have a better year. But he could have a better basketball season and see his numbers go down a little bit. In fact, that might be in our team's best interest because we are so deep. What we need from Julius is better defense and a little bit more offensive rebounding."

Among the newcomers on the team, perhaps the loftiest expectations are attached to junior forward Rayshawn Goins, a bruising presence at 6-6 and 250 pounds. The junior college transfer from Cincinnati State is a likely candidate to join the starting lineup immediately at the power forward spot and will force teams to split their attention in the paint between Bowles and Goins. He ranked 13th nationally in Division II of the National Junior College Athletic Association with 22.2 points per game and sixth with 12.4 rebounds per game while posting career

highs of 47 points and 20 rebounds.

"I think Rayshawn's impact is going to be significant. He's got a chance to be as good as Denzel and as good as any front-court player in this league. He needs to get in better shape if he wants to play at this level athletically and defensively. But his Godgiven ability is significant. You never know with a junior college transfer what their first year will bring, but he's certainly an impact player for us."

Goins will have a level of familiarity with the

Dukes thanks to the presence of seven players on the roster from Ohio, most notably his JuCo teammate, junior guard James Millen. Like Goins, Millen could also join the starting lineup immediately at the second guard position. Last year, he teamed with Goins to lead Cincinnati State to a national runner-up finish. He averaged 13.8 points, ranked 23rd nationally with 5.6 assists, and ranked 22nd with 2.6 steals per game.

"Like Rayshawn, James has the potential to have a huge impact on our program. He's a left-handed guard who can play two different positions. He's a remarkably-improved shooter and was incredibly under-recruited. We think he's anywhere from a starter to a sixth-man of the year in the CAA."

More significant than any newcomer for the Dukes will be the return of a healthy Moore at the point guard position. The floor general earned CAA All-Rookie honors two years ago before missing all of last year injured. He started all but one game as a freshman and averaged 10.7 points per game while posting 92 assists and ranking second in the league with a .846 free-throw percentage.

"I've always said that Devon is a really great college basketball player, but he is a great player in the last five minutes of a game," commented Brady. "What I've also always said is that he is an incredibly mature defensive player and he takes much pride in his teammates. That's rare in a player. We're fortunate that one of our best players takes so much pride defensively and has a chance to be a leader on this team. He plays with his heart and plays as hard off the ball as he does on the ball. He doesn't need to shoot to impact the game and it's critically important to have players like that. It's a bonus when it's your point guard."

Like Moore, sophomore forward Andrey Semenov also returns from injury. His back problems will require monitoring throughout the season, but one benefit of the improved depth is that the Dukes don't need to feel pressured to overplay Semenov. He has demonstrated one of the better shooting touches in the league and as a freshman led the conference in free-throw percentage at .865. He averaged 8.2 points and 4.1 rebounds per game.

"I don't know if Andrey will ever be 100 percent healthy, but even if he's at 90 percent, he's a really good player. He's the most improved player on our team in terms of shooting and I think that's going to be a tremendous advantage to our team. That will show itself at many different times this season. Like many of our players, he's a multi-positional player. We play him a lot in the low post, but he's equally lethal now on the perimeter. That wasn't necessarily the case as a freshman, but now he's a really hard guy to guard."

Two Division I transfers also join the fold for the Dukes this season, both as juniors with two years of eligibility. Humpty Hitchens arrives from Akron and was awarded immediate eligibility by the NCAA just one week prior to preseason

practices. He has appeared in 68 career games and holds a career scoring average of 8.6 points/game. In league play, he ranked fourth in the Mid-American Conference with a 1.84 assist-to-turnover ratio. He led the Zips in assists both years with a two-year total of 169.

Davis, the cousin of Moore, played the last two seasons at Wyoming in the Mountain West Conference. Last year he averaged 10.0 points per game to rank third on the team, including a fourgame stretch averaging 16.8 points per game. Like most Division I transfers, Davis will sit out the 2010-11 season but will be a tremendous attribute to the Dukes in practice settings.

"The combination of Humpty and A.J. is as good as any backcourt in the CAA. I think they both have great leadership qualities, but both with different styles. A.J. is a little bit quieter, a little more thoughtful. Humpty's leadership style is a little more intuitive or heart-felt. He's going to tell you exactly how he feels. Both guys only care about winning and getting better. Their leadership qualities will be a great benefit to our program."

Returning at the forward position will be 6-11 sophomore Trevon Flores. Due to injuries and other ineligibilities, he was pressed into significant playing time in his first college season and averaged 3.8 points and 3.0 rebounds in 32 games. He also set a JMU freshman record with 37 blocks.

"Trevon has the opportunity to play the same number of minutes this year. His greatest attribute now is the game experience that he gained last year, which he needed. I think now he recognizes that he can have an impact on a game. The role he'll fill for us is that he has to be more of an energy guy."

Also back as a second-year player is wing player Alioune Diouf. Like Flores, he was also pressed into more minutes than expected as a freshman, appearing in 32 games and averaging 3.2 points and 2.8 rebounds per game.

"Alioune is kind of the wild card of the group. He's certainly improved as a shooter and as a protector of the basketball, and he's working hard defensively.



Like Trevon, he's grown from his experience last year. He's a really eager basketball player. He wants to do well, but like Trevon, he needs to take care of the basketball, rebound offensively, not force plays, and raise the level of his defense."

Three true freshmen join the mix for the Dukes with the biggest impact expected from shooting guard Chad Jackson. A runner-up for Mr. Basketball in the state of Kentucky, Jackson, along with Millen and Hitchens, will be a candidate to step in immediately as a starter at the second guard position.

"Chad is a guy who can start on this year's team, and if we were less offensively gifted, he could be an offensive player of the year candidate. I don't know if there are many players coming

into the league as basketball-savvy as Chad as far as his IQ and defensive fundamentals. He's coming from one of the winningest high school programs in the state of Kentucky. He's done nothing but win his entire career. Like Devon, he knows how to win. His future is extremely bright."

Two other freshmen guards also join the mix in Andre Prince and Kevin McGaughey. Prince hails from Houston, Texas while McGaughey is a native of Ashburn, Va. Brady stated, "Both guys have the ability to make shots and play within their limitations. Both are really eager to be part of the program and are great players. They both came from winning high school programs with Prince coming from one of the winningest programs in Texas. They both feel they belong on this level, and as a defender, you have to guard them."

### CAA

The goal for nearly every team in the CAA is to place in the top four and earn the coveted first-round bye in the tournament. For the Dukes, that position has eluded them since the league expanded to 12 teams. They hope, however, that this is the year to propel to that position, despite the difficulty of a jump from 11th to fourth in the standings.

Brady said, "Certainly our goal is to finish in the top four, and I feel good about that as a goal for the next three years, given the players we have and the youth of our team. To me, there's a clear top three in some order of George Mason, Old Dominion, and VCU. Beyond that, I think three teams to look at are William and Mary, Northeastern, and Hofstra, probably in reverse order. I expect Hofstra to be a team to watch. Despite having a new staff and losing some transfers, they had a couple of guys sitting out last year and brought in some really good players, not to mention having the returning CAA Player of the Year in Charles Jenkins."

## **SCHEDULE**

JMU will find out just how high to raise the optimism very early as the Dukes open with the

O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic at Kansas State, a likely top 10 team in the country and the preseason favorite in the Big XII Conference. The Dukes also face top 100 RPI teams in Marshall (home and away), South Florida of the Big East, and Kent State, in addition to high RPI teams in the CAA in ODU, VCU, George Mason, Northeastern, and W&M and a potential high RPI game in the ESPN BracketBusters event in February. JMU will also host a four-team Subregional in the CBE Classic Nov. 22-24, welcoming Princeton, Presbyterian, and Bucknell with doubleheaders each day.


"The CBE Classic presents some challenging games with Kansas State, Princeton, and Bucknell," commented Brady. "We'll learn a lot about ourselves in that event. Marshall is a better team in terms of personnel than when we signed the contract to play them. The schedule is becoming even more difficult as see some of the improvements from various teams. Kent State is one of the best teams in their league historically, and South Florida on the road will also be a tough game. It's hard to win on the road, but it's even harder to win on the road against teams that don't lose at home. I think the schedule is harder than it's been, and that's been our mission.

Like every year, the season will culminate with the 12-team CAA Tournament at the Richmond Coliseum during the first weekend of March. Firstround games will be held Friday, March 4 with the championship game airing on ESPN Monday night at 7 p.m.

### **KEYS TO SUCCESS**

While a lot appears to be in place for a successful season, Brady points to one key factor in how far the Dukes can go in 2010-11.

"Truthfully, I look at our health. If I knew we were going to be healthy, I could have challenged us more in scheduling. For the first time, we have some depth, so we can weather some bumps and bruises. If we can stay healthy, we can easily contend for a top four spot in the CAA and then be playing our best basketball come March."

His 17 field goals matched JMU's No.3 game mark and are its second best in Division I. His 25 shots matched JMU's No. 7 game mark.
- Vs. Radford had 17 points, 15 rebounds, five assists and four blocks. Was the first Duke since 1976-77 to have 15 points and rebounds and five assists during a game.
- At Georgia State Feb. 16 had 34 points, matching the No. 14 game-scoring mark in JMU varsity history. Had 31 points on 13-of-17 shooting at Virginia Commonwealth Feb. 24.
- During the CAA Tournament had 22 points and 10 rebounds vs. Drexel and 17 points and 15 rebounds vs. William & Mary.
- Vs. Towson in a 69-66 win Jan. 9 had 21 points and eight rebounds. Had six blocks, matching the then-No. 6 mark in team history and the then-best mark by a Duke since Kenny Whitehead's (2001-03) seven at Furman Nov. 22, 2002. Had 14 second-half points, including a dunk at 1:36 to tie the score at 66-66.
- Vs. Fordham had team highs of 24 points and 13 rebounds, including 19 points and 10 rebounds after JMU trailed 41-32 at halftime. Also had four assists and two blocked shots. Had seven points and assisted on a three-pointer during JMU's 12-0 run to start the final half. Had six points and seven rebounds during an 18-2 run after JMU trailed 67-66.



# Head Coach Matt Brady

Year At JMU: Third Career Year: Seventh Career Record: 107-85

Matt Brady enters his third campaign as JMU's men's basketball coach with the 2010-11 season. He holds a 34-35 record through two seasons after going 21-15 in his first season and producing the program's first winning record in nine seasons. He followed that with a 13-20 campaign in 2009-10 with a squad that was decimated by injuries.

The second season for Brady started with much promise as four starters returned, including the reigning CAA Rookie of the Year in Julius Wells and an All-Rookie selection in Devon Moore, along with the anticipated second-semester debut of Texas A&M transfer forward Denzel Bowles.

However, the high anticipation was dissipated quickly as Moore went down in the preseason with an injury, starting forward Andrey Semenov missed all but four games due to injury, and forward Dazzmond Thornton was unavailable for the second semester.

With so many missing pieces, the Dukes compiled a 13-20 overall record and finished 11th in the CAA at 4-14. Despite the depleted roster, JMU took down sixth-place Drexel in the CAA Championship opening round and led eventual runner-up William and Mary in the semifinals by 14 points early in the second half before falling on a late rally by the Tribe.

Among the highlights, senior guard Pierre Curtis shifted into the starting point guard role in Moore's absence and placed in the top five in the league in assists (4.2 per game) and assists-to-turnover ratio (1.9). He established JMU records for minutes (4,137), games (126), starts (124), assists (463), and steals (175) while also finishing 16th in career points with 1,237.

Bowles did not disappoint when he became eligible after seven games. He became the first player in CAA history to lead the league in scoring (20.8 points/game), rebounding (9.2 per game) and field-goal percentage (.594), earning him Second Team All-CAA accolades. His 12 double-doubles in just 25 games already ranks third in JMU history.

Wells, pressed into a high-scoring role, earned Third Team All-CAA honors after averaging 16.3 points to rank in the top five in the CAA while also averaging 5.1 rebounds per game. He established JMU sophomore records for three-pointers (91), minutes (1,211), points (539), field-goal attempts (470), and three-point attempts (258).

Brady's first JMU squad compiled a 21-15 overall record and a 9-9 Colonial Athletic Association mark in 2008-09. The Dukes advanced in the CAA Tournament and reached the semifinals of the post-season CollegeInsider.com Tournament.

JMU's 21 wins matched the second-best season total in team history and were the Dukes' most in a season since 1992-93. JMU reached the 20-win plateau for the first time since compiling a 20-9 record in 1999-2000, the most-recent time the Dukes had finished a season with a winning record.

JMU's nine conference wins were its most in a season since finishing 12-4 in 1999-2000; the Dukes advanced in CAA Tournament for the first time since 2002-03; and their post-season tournament appearance was the program's first since 1993-94.

Brady joined the JMU staff after four seasons as head coach at Marist, and his first JMU team combined a nucleus of veteran players and an impressive group of newcomers. Senior forwards Juwann James and Kyle Swanston were the team's No. 1 and No. 3 scorers and junior guard Pierre Curtis its No. 5 scorer. Freshmen Julius Wells, Devon Moore and Andrey Semenov gave the Dukes the CAA's leading group of first-year contributors.

James was second-team All-CAA and led JMU with a 14.1-points-per-game scoring average; Swanston averaged 11.6 points and had 95 three-point field goals; and Curtis averaged 9.3 points and 2.8 assists. Wells was second on the team in scoring (11.6) and its leading rebounder (5.5) and was CAA rookie of the year. Moore joined Wells on the league all-rookie team and averaged 10.7 points and 2.9 assists, and Semenov averaged 8.2 points despite seeing only limited time late during the season because of illness.

JMU during the 2008-09 season improved its scoring differential from the previous season from minus-1.1 to plus-2.1, its scoring defense from 74.0 points per game to 68.5, its field goal percentage defense from 48.5 percent to 42.3 and its three-point shooting percentage defense from 36.9 percent to 30.6.


Brady was introduced as JMU's head coach March 26, 2008 on the playing floor of the JMU Convocation Center after developing the Marist program into a top contender in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference

"We are excited about the hiring of Matt Brady as our men's basketball coach and the future of the JMU program under his direction," said Jeff Bourne, JMU's athletics director in announcing Brady's hring. "He's an energetic, hard-working young coach whose background demonstrates he can coach, teach and attract student-athletes at a challenging level of play. Matt has proven himself at the assistant coach's level and has had outstanding success as a head coach while building the Marist program; we feel that he is an excellent fit at JMU."

Brady assumed responsibility for a program that had gone eight seasons without a winning record but was enthusiastic about the opportunity to be at JMU and to compete in the CAA.

"I think JMU has incredible potential," he said.
"The expectations for the program need to be
more than they've been. Our feeling is that with
the right staff and the right group of players that
we can get to the top of the league. I can't envision
another program in the league having more potential. It's incumbent on us to get it done."

Brady accomplished plenty at Marist, compiling a 73-50 record in four seasons with the Red Foxes and improving their wins total from the previous year during each of his first three seasons with the



A 1987 Siena graduate and a native of Haddon Heights, N.J., Brady was the head coach at Marist from 2004-08. He previously was an assistant at St. Joseph's from 1993-2004, at Wagner from 1989-93 and at Rhode Island from 1987-89.

Marist in 2007-08 was 18-14 despite playing most the second half of the season without its second-leading scorer. The Red Foxes were 25-9 in 2006-07 when they won their first Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference regular-season title and posted a National Invitation Tournament win at Oklahoma State. They were 19-10 in 2005-06 and 11-17 in 2004-05 after being 6-22 in 2003-04, the season before Brady's hiring.



Before assuming Marist's head coaching position, Brady was a Division I assistant coach for 17 seasons. He worked at Rhode Island under Tom Penders from 1987-89, at Wagner under Tim Capstraw from 1989-93, and at St. Joseph's from 1993-2004 under John Griffin for two seasons and Phil Martelli for nine.

Marist in 2007-08 under Brady was 11-7 in MAAC regular-season play and reached the semifinals of the league tournament. The Red Foxes played 13 games without 12.1-points-per-game scorer Louie McCroskey and in non-league play had victories over Bucknell, Colgate, Richmond, Wright State and Colonial Athletic Association members Delaware and Hofstra. Their non-league losses were to Cleveland State, Houston, Massachusetts, Miami, St. John's and Temple.

During the 2007-08 season, Marist averaged 8.0 three-point field goals made and 21.0 three-pointers attempted per game and had MAAC co-freshman of the year Jay Gavin, who led the team with a 12.3-point-per-game scoring average.

The Red Foxes set a team record for wins during their 25-9 season in 2006-07 when Brady was the MAAC and New York City-area coach of the year. They had the MAAC player of the year in guard Jared Jordan, a two-time NCAA Division I assists champion and the 45th overall choice in the National Basketball Association draft by the Los Angeles Clippers. Their roster also included guard Will Whittington, who led the nation with 137 three-pointers and finished his career ranked 15th in NCAA history in three-pointers made.

Marist in 2006-07 played in the inaugural Old Spice Classic at the Disney Wide World of Sports Complex, and the Red Foxes in 2007-08 took part in the inaugural O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tip-Off Tournament that included three nationally televised games. They had wins over Minnesota and Western Michigan in the Old Spice Classic and met Miami, Houston and Temple that season in

Marist in 2005-06 had 19 wins in a season for only the fifth time in team history and compiled an eight-game winning streak, the program's longest in more than six years. Jordan led the nation in assists for the first of two seasons, averaging 8.5 per game, and was first-team All-MAAC, and Whittington was third-team All-MAAC after averaging more than 15 points per game and having 103 three-pointers.

Whittington and Jordan both also received all-league honors in 2004-05 during Brady's first Marist season.

While Brady was at St. Joseph's, the Hawks appeared in the NCAA Tournament four times and the NIT three times and won four Big 5 championships and three Atlantic 10 titles. St. Joseph's in 2003-04 was 27-0 during the regular season, earned a No. 1 national ranking and a top seed for the NCAA Tournament, and reached the Elite Eight during the postseason.

Brady was involved in recruiting several of the top players in St. Joseph's history, including 2004 national player of the year Jameer Nelson, who was freshman of the year by Sports Illustrated and Eastern Basketball. He also took part in recruiting Delonte West, who was player of the year in the Washington, D.C., area, an honorable mention Associated Press All-America and a second-team All-America by Sports Illustrated, and Abdulai Jalloh, who played two seasons at St. Joseph's and two at JMU.

Brady was credited with impressive shooting by players at St. Joseph's, whose 2003-04 squad set a team record with 313 threepoint field goals. Marist also had dramatic statistical improvements under his direction,



his four seasons. The Red Foxes were ninth in the league in field goal percentage, 10th in three-point percentage and sixth in three-pointers per game the season before his arrival.

Marist during the 2005-06 season led the MAAC and was ninth nationally with a .490 shooting percentage for the season.

As a player at Siena, Brady appeared in 114 career games, including 92 as a starter. He completed his career as the program's all-time assists leader (593), and he was inducted into the school's hall of fame in 1993. For his career he averaged 9.7 points per game and was a 45.9 percent shooter from the

Brady was a standout at Paul VI High School in Haddon (N.J.) Township and was named to the 1980s South Jersey All-Decade Team.

Brady and his wife, Mary, have three young sons -- Logan and twins Cole and Griffin.

Rob O'Driscoll joined the JMU staff immediately after Matt Brady's hiring as head coach in March 2008 and serves as the associate head coach on the Dukes' staff. He assists in every aspect of the program's organization and operation.

O'Driscoll was Brady's top assistant during each of the head coach's four years (2004-2008) at Marist, and served as recruiting coordinator. He was also responsible for the team's scheduling, handled opponent scouting duties, and worked with player development. O'Driscoll was very instrumental in the development of 2007 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Player of the Year Jared Jordan, who went on to become the 45th overall selection in the 2007 NBA Draft.

"Rob has been with me the entire time I've been a head coach and is a tremendous asset," Brady said. "He's very detail-oriented and incredibly thorough. He's an outstanding coach who keeps me on track."

While at Marist, O'Driscoll helped the Red Foxes to a 73-50 overall record and to the MAAC regular-season championship in 2006-07 when Brady was league and New York City area Coach of the Year. Marist won at Oklahoma State in the postseason National Invitation Tournament in 2007.

Marist improved its victories total from the previous year during each of the first three seasons O'Driscoll assisted Brady, and the Red Foxes went 18-14 in 2007-08, despite playing most of the second half of the season without their second-leading scorer. The 2006-07 team went 25-9 and won the school's MAAC regular-season championship before being invited to the NIT. Marist was 11-17 and 19-10 during Brady's first two seasons after going 6-22 the year before his hiring.

O'Driscoll went to Marist after six seasons as an assistant at Iona under Jeff Ruland. At Iona, he helped the Gaels win back-to-back MAAC titles and earn NCAA tournament berths in 1999-2000 and 2000-01, while helping them achieve an overall record of 98-81. O'Driscoll also worked from 1996-98 as an assistant coach at Manhattan College under John Leonard.

The Philadelphia native began his coaching career in 1994 at Villanova, where, as the administrative assistant, he helped the Wildcats earn consecutive top-10 final national rankings, and a No. 3 seed in both the 1995 and 1996 NCAA tournaments.

As a college undergraduate, O'Driscoll lettered three times in tennis at Villanova and was selected to the 1992-93 Big East All-Academic Team. He received his undergraduate degree in accounting and a master's in business administration from Villanova in 1997.

O'Driscoll is married to the former Suzanne Lowry. They reside in Harrisonburg.









# Assistant Coach Corey Stitzel

Year at JMU: Third

Hometown: Philadelphia, Pa. College: Elizabethtown 2002

Corey Stitzel joined the JMU coaching staff as an assistant coach soon after Matt Brady's hiring as head coach in March 2008.

Entering his third JMU season, Stitzel has been Brady's lead recruiter with the Dukes and is responsible for landing three CAA All-Rookie Team honorees in his first two seasons. They include 2008-09 CAA Rookie of Year Julius Wells and runner-up Devon Moore as well as 2009-10 CAA All-Rookie selection Darren White.

Under Brady, JMU has had great success recruiting in the Midwest and particularly the state of Ohio,. The 2010-11 roster features seven players with ties to the Buckeye State and another located one hour outside of Cincinnati. Each was attracted to JMU by Stitzel

Beyond his heavy emphasis on recruiting, Stitzel assists with both game scouting ingame coaching. His coaching emphasis lies with the offense with particular attention to guards.

Stitzel coached with Brady at Marist during the 2007-08 season and also was head coach at Division III Neumann College, where in his only year his team went 13-13 overall and 10-8 in the league. It was the first winning conference record for the team in five seasons. While at Neumann, his team was known for its fast-pace, high-octane offense and tenacious pressure defense. The Knights ranked fifth nationally in scoring and led the nation in forcing turnovers.

"Corey is in his fourth season as a member of my staff, and he has proven to be as thorough and as hard working a recruiter as anyone could have," Brady said. "He's a tireless worker who has been instrumental in several of our most important signings. He's wiser than his years and has great potential in the coaching profession."

Before coaching at Neumann, Stitzel was the top assistant at Division II Gannon for one season and for three seasons was associate head coach at Division II power Philadelphia University under head coach Herb Magee, who has since become the all-time leader in coaching victories at any level of the NCAA. Philadelphia University received a No. 1 national ranking by Street & Smith's. Among

the top-level recruits Stitzel was the lead recruiter in attracting to Philadelphia University were Tayron Thomas and Christian Burns, who earned back-to-back National Player of the Year recognitions.

Stitzel began coaching at Division III Elizabethtown College, where he was a two-year letterman as an undergraduate and was a feared three-point shooter before a back injury later ended his playing career. He was hired as a full-time assistant while he was an undergrad and was named the program's top recruiter.

In two playing seasons under head coach Bob Schlosser, the Blue Jays went 16-10 in 1998-99 and 13-12 in 1999-2000. After he became a coach under Schlosser, the 2000-01 team went 20-6 while the following squad went 29-3, set school records for wins and winning percentage, and reached the DIII national championship game. His two recruiting classes while a coach at E-Town proved to be key to three consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament.

Originally hailing from suburban Philadelphia, Stitzel attended Quakertown High School, where he was a four-year starter, and completed his career ranked in the program's top five in points, three-point field goals and assists. His brother, Casey, is the head coach at Division III Delaware Valley College and was the nation's youngest head coach at age 26 at the time.









# Assistant Coach Louis Rowe

**Year at JMU: Fourth** 

Hometown: St. Petersburg, Fla. College: James Madison 1995

Louis Rowe joined Matt Brady's coaching staff for his second stint as an assistant with the Dukes on Friday, July 2, 2010.

"I'm excited for Louis to be back in this full-time position," commented Brady on the hiring for his third season with the Dukes. "I'm excited for JMU. He fully demonstrated his passion for JMU in general and our program in particular. He is a guy with a bright future and has everything you're looking for in a coach. He works hard and possesses good skill knowledge. I'm excited that we have the opportunity to move him up."

Rowe offered assistance to the program for the last two years while pursuing his graduate degree from JMU. Prior to that, he worked one season as an assistant coach in 2007-08 under the previous coaching staff of Dean Keener.

"I'm very excited," stated Rowe on his appointment with the Dukes. "I'm obviously committed to this staff, the program, and the university. I'm looking forward to getting to work."

Rowe played at JMU from 1993-95 and was a member of the Dukes' 1994 Colonial Athletic Association championship team. He earned All-CAA honors as a team captain in 1994-95 when he averaged 21.7 points per game, a figure that still ranks as JMU's fifth-best varsity season scoring mark.

A St. Petersburg, Fla., native, Rowe played for two seasons at the University of Florida before transferring to JMU and sitting out the 1992-93 season under NCAA transfer rules. Under then-JMU coach "Lefty" Driesell, he started each of the Dukes' games during their 20-10 season in 1993-94 and their 16-13 campaign in 1994-95. He was a Second Team All-CAA selection in 1993-94 when he averaged 14.2 points and 5.0 rebounds per game and a First Team All-League choice in 1994-95 when he averaged 21.7 points and 5.7 rebounds.

JMU won the 1993-94 CAA Tournament before falling 64-62 to eventual Final Four participant Florida in the first round of NCAA play. The Dukes were second in the 1994-95 CAA Tournament.

Rowe finished his two JMU seasons with 1,055 points (17.9 per game), 315 rebounds (5.3 per game), 177 assists (3.0 per game), 48 steals (0.8 per game) and 80 blocked shots (1.4 per game). He ranks fourth on JMU's

career scoring average list and eighth on its career blocked shots list. He was a 52.2 percent career shooter from the field (409-783) and a 73.5 percent career shooter from the foul line (191-260), and he had 46 career three-point field goals.

Following his two seasons at JMU, Rowe played professionally abroad from 1995-2004. His professional career included time in Sweden, Germany, Belgium, France, Israel and Greece. He was a member of championship teams in 1995 (Sweden) and 2000 (Belgium).

After his professional career,
Rowe was an assistant basketball coach at Osceola (Fla.) High School in 2005-06 and completed his JMU degree in business administration during the summer of 2006. He coached the head coach for

one season at Dixie Hollis High School in St. Petersburg, Fla. while also teaching mathematics.

Rowe fills the position on Brady's staff vacated by Carlin Hartman, who left the Dukes after one season to become associate head coach at Columbia.









# Director of Operations Kevin Hargrove

Year at JMU: Third

Hometown: District Heights, Md.

College: Howard 1994

Kevin Hargrove is in his third season with the James Madison men's basketball staff. He joined the Dukes during the summer of 2008 after spending the previous six years in Raleigh, N.C., where he was the associate head men's basketball coach at St. Augustine's College.

In his role as director of basketball operations, he is involved in all aspects of the dayto-day operations of the program, including team travel, academics, dining contracts, alumni relations, and on-campus recruiting. Additionally, Hargrove started the Champions Read Program that works with elementary schools in Rockingham County.

Having been an assistant and head coach at the high school, AAU, and college levels, Hargrove brings with him an extensive background in coaching and teaching to JMU basketball. In 1997, he was an assistant coach for the McDonald's All-American Game, and he was the assistant (1991-1997) and head coach (1997-1999) at Anacostia High School in Washington, D.C. The Anacostia program garnered several championships and was recognized as one the top programs in the Mid-Atlantic region during the 1990s.

Along with being an outstanding prep coach, Hargrove also has excelled as an AAU coach in the metropolitan area. His teams, Maryland Slam-N-Jam and Cityline (D.C.), won numerous tournaments, and he helped develop many players who went on to play at the college level.


Hargrove was a head coach in the Long Beach/FILA Summer-Pro Basketball League (1998-1999). He also has worked as a personal trainer for numerous professional basketball players, and he coached several current and former players in the National Basketball Association, including Steve Francis, Joe Smith, Lonny Baxter, and Toby Bailey.

Hargrove has been involved in the coaching aspect of sports all of his life. While many youths grew up aspiring to be professional athletes, he always knew that he was going to be a coach. He assumed his first coaching

position on the high school level, at age 19. Along with his vast knowledge of the game, his communication skills have allowed him to be a great teacher and mentor.

Hargrove's father, Thomas, was a successful high school coach for 28 years and is the winningest coach in Washington, D.C., public school history. He was inducted into the D.C. Coaches' Hall of Fame, and he recently finished a 10-year stint as a head coach at the Division II level.

Off the court, Hargrove has extensive outreach experience in community relations and youth development programs as well as strong multi-media experience in print, radio, and television. From 1995-1999, he served as the director of the Fountain of Youth High School Basketball summer league. He also served as the southeast regional scout for Generation Next Basketball Scouting Service.

Patrick Massaroni is in his first season as a graduate assistant for the JMU men's basketball program, assisting in all off-court activities for the team.

Massaroni arrived in Harrisonburg following four years as a team manager at his alma mater, Marist College. He served as a manager for the men's program for three seasons, including two years under current JMU head coach Matt Brady (2006-08) and two years as the program's head manager (2007-09). 








# **JMU TIMELINE**





- 1908 On March 14, Virginia Governor Claude A. Swanson signed the General Assembly bill creating the State Normal and Industrial School for Women at Harrisonburg. Julian Ashby Burruss was named first president of the new school.
- 1909 The school opened with an enrollment of 150 and a faculty of 15 on a campus of about 50 acres.
- 1910 The school operated its first summer session -- the first held in Virginia. Male and female students attended.
- 1911 The first 20 graduates received diplomas.
- 1914 The school's name was shortened to the State Normal School for Women at Harrisonburg.
- 1916 Authorization was received for the school to award bachelor's degrees. Previously, only diplomas for post-high school work had been awarded.
- 1919 Dr. Samuel Page Duke became the institution's second president.
- 1924 The institution was renamed the State Teachers College at Harrisonburg.
- 1938 The institution was renamed Madison College in honor of President James Madison. Enrollment passed 1,000.
- 1946 Men were first enrolled during the regular session but only as day students.
- 1949 Dr. G. Tyler Miller became the institution's third president.
- 1954 The college was authorized to award master's degrees.
- 1964 Enrollment passed 2,000.
- 1966 The General Assembly approved full coeducational status for the college, and men were enrolled as resident students for the first time.
- 1971 Dr. Ronald E. Carrier became the institution's fourth president.
- 1972 Enrollment passed 5,000.
- 1977 The institution was renamed James Madison University.
- 1983 JMU celebrated its 75th anniversary.
- 1987 Enrollment passed 10,000.
- 1995 JMU began its first doctoral program.



- 1998 Dr. Linwood H. Rose became the institution's fifth president.
- 2001 Enrollment reached 15,000, with a full-time faculty and staff of more than 2,000 on a 495-acre campus.
- 2005 JMU announced plans to purchase 15.8-acre Rockingham Memorial Hospital site, adjacent to the JMU campus, when the hospital moves to a new site in 2010.
- 2006 JMU purchased the former Harrisonburg High School and renamed it Memorial Hall.
- 2007-08 JMU celebrated its Centennial.



# **Dr. Linwood Rose**

## **President**

Dr. Linwood H. Rose became the fifth president of James Madison University in September 1998. Under his leadership, JMU has developed a reputation as one of the top public universities in the nation.

JMU offers a student-centered atmosphere that blends the best attributes of a liberal arts education, including superlative teaching and high levels of service and support, with the best qualities found at larger doctoral universities, including a wide breadth of programs, world-class faculty, state-of-the-art facilities and opportunities for students to be actively involved in research and discovery.



National surveys continue to cite the university's academic excellence and its emphasis on student involvement and civic engagement. JMU has also established itself as a leader in institutional performance measurement, accountability and assessment of student learning. The university has been recognized for offering proven value and an excellent return on investment to its students.

Founded in 1908, the university recently completed a year-long celebration in honor of the institution's 100th anniversary. Under Dr. Rose's direction, the university community has inaugurated several new transformational initiatives which will chart the course for the university's second century. These initiatives include enhanced diversity, the creation of a comprehensive campus master plan, and the Institute for Stewardship of the Natural World to promote a culture of sustainability on the JMU campus.

Central to Dr. Rose's administration have been efforts to diversify and expand JMU's funding portfolio. The university successfully completed its first comprehensive capital campaign, benefiting from \$70 million in contributions for scholarships, faculty support, and ongoing support for academic, co-curricular, and capital projects. The university's budget has doubled since 1998, and JMU's sponsored program activity also has expanded significantly. The university also has developed a strategic partnership with SRI International, a California-based research institute.

Since Dr. Rose became president, more than a million square feet of new facilities have been added to the JMU campus and 20 new academic programs, including six doctoral programs, have been approved. Dr. Rose also led efforts to align the university more closely with the legacy of President James Madison, the fourth U.S. President and primary author of the U.S. Constitution. JMU is the only university in America named for Mr. Madison.

In addition to his leadership role at JMU, Dr. Rose has represented JMU and



Virginia in a variety of important roles on national, regional and state commissions and advisory boards.

Dr. Rose serves as the only higher education representative on the National Infrastructure **Advisory Committee that** reports to the President of the United States. The committee makes recommendations regarding the security of the cyber and information systems of the United States. (JMU is one of seven charter members of the National Security Agency's Centers of **Excellence in Information** 

Security Education.)

Dr. Rose was formerly chair of the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), the regional accrediting agency for 11 Southern states. He also has served as commissioner, Virginia state chairman, committee chair and executive council member for SACS. In addition, Dr. Rose served as a member of the Division I board of directors of the National Collegiate Athletic Association from 2000-04 and also has served as the Virginia state representative to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU).

He is a member and former president of the Council of Presidents, an organization of the presidents of Virginia's senior colleges and universities. He serves on boards of directors for the Philpott Manufacturing Partnership and SunTrust Bank, Harrisonburg and is also a member of the Harrisonburg Downtown Renaissance Advisory Board.

Dr. Rose previously has served as chairman of the board of Rockingham Memorial Hospital, as president and campaign chairman of the Harrisonburg-Rockingham

County United Way, and as a member of the James Madison Commemorative Commission of the U.S. Congress.

Dr. Rose began his professional career with JMU in 1975, and his assignments have included responsibilities in every division of the university. He took a leave from the university during the fall of 1985 to serve as Virginia's deputy secretary of education. In 1994 Dr. Rose was promoted to the position of executive vice president. He served as acting president during the fall of 1997 and was tapped to be JMU's chief executive the following September. He was formally inaugurated Sept. 17, 1999.

Dr. Rose grew up in Staunton, Va. He holds degrees from Virginia Tech, The University of Tennessee and the University of Virginia.




# ATHLETICS FACILITIES



James Madison University has made a commitment to its athletics program and the facilities needed to give the teams the best opportunity to succeed in the conference, regionally and nationally.

- Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field is currently undergoing a two-year renovation that will raise football capacity from
  16,000 to 25,000 for the 2011 season. The expanded facility, which
  already features an artificial grass playing surface and the APC end
  zone facility, will add a second deck of seating, a club level, private
  luxury suites, a new press box, and a larger scoreboard.
- Godwin Hall houses a 5,000-seat gymnasium, an 800-seat natatorium and areas for strength training and indoor practices.
- Facilities also include a lighted, two-field soccer/lacrosse complex, and a lighted field hockey/track and field complex with a synthetic playing surface.
- JMU's baseball and softball programs began play in the spring of 2010 in the new Veterans Memorial Park complex, a lighted facility that provides an outstanding playing venue for each program. The new complex includes new stadiums with top-of-the line amenities and press box as well as new offices, locker rooms and indoor practice facilities in the adjacent Memorial Hall.
- The golf programs will enjoy a new on-campus short-game practice facility, including chipping and putting greens with a variety of terrain to give the teams the ability to practice in short time frames.
- Construction has begun on University Park off Port Republic Road, which will have recreation facilities as well as practice and competition facilities for men's and women's soccer, women's lacrosse and women's track and field in the spring of 2012, with an eventual expansion for field hockey at the facility.

# **Jeff Bourne**

# **Athletics Director**

Jeff Bourne is in his second decade as JMU's athletics director, having already overseen a period of dramatic enhancements on behalf of all of the university's student-athletes and coaches. At JMU, Bourne leads a program that is competitive within the Colonial Athletic Association as well as at regional and national levels and that has positioned itself to continue to play a major role in intercollegiate athletics.

Bourne has overseen processes to ensure the academic, athletic and social success of all JMU student-athletes. In 2008-09, JMU celebrated an 80 percent

graduation rate among its student-athletes, compared with JMU's general student population rate of 81 percent. When Bourne arrived at JMU, the graduation rate among student-athletes was 71 percent and the overall student rate 79 percent. Annual fundraising has improved dramatically under Bourne's leadership, with an overall increase of more than 400 percent during the past eight years. Student-athlete support services and facility improvements also have been highlights of the past 10 years.

JMU enjoys a tremendous academic reputation nationally as evidenced by its continued placement among national and regional publications. For the 16th consecutive year the university ranked as the top public, master's-level university in the South in the highly regarded annual poll on academic quality conducted by U.S. News & World Report for its guidebook, 2010 America's Best Colleges.

During Bourne's tenure more than 1,000 conference academic honors have been given to JMU student-athletes, including CAA scholar-athletes, CAA commissioner's academic award winners and ECAC scholar-athletes of the year. JMU also has had four student-athletes receive NCAA post-graduate scholarships.

Perhaps the best measure of success is the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate. JMU has ranked well above the NCAA minimum standard for each of the program's rating periods, and no JMU teams have been subject to APR-related penalties. Seven of JMU's 18 teams had APR scores ranking in at least the 90th percentile of their respective sports in the most-recent APR release, the greatest number reaching that mark among any of the 12 CAA institutions.

Providing outstanding athletics facilities is a primary focus, and JMU will continue to make significant progress in this front during the coming year. In 2009-10, the new Veterans Memorial Stadium complex for baseball and softball will be completed; work will begin on the new Sports Park, including practice and competition facilities for field hockey, soccer, lacrosse, track and field and cross country; and the \$62 Million, 20-month process to renovate Bridgeforth Stadium/ Zane Showker Field will begin.

The football stadium expansion project will increase seating at the facility to nearly 25,000 and will feature major enhancements, including private suites and club level seating, improved concessions and restroom facilities, improved lighting, and a new media facility.

Under Bourne, JMU has developed an enhanced volunteer fundraising network and a point-priority system to recognize donor participation and has implemented programs to increase game attendance and address the needs of athletics infrastructure. These efforts have



resulted in unprecedented levels of success in fundraising while driving football attendance to all-time records.

Major program enhancements in student-athlete services and academic advising, sports medicine and strength and conditioning have added to the overall quality of the student-athlete experience as demonstrated in annual senior exit interviews and peer program evaluations. Annual evaluation and information data also is incorporated into a strategic planning and reporting

process to enhance the organizational structure of the athletics division with the primary focus on meeting the needs of student-athletes and coaches.

"We're very proud of the accomplishments we've had and I am quite fortunate to work with and serve a tremendous group of coaches and a talented support team. We will continue to work together toward the common goals of ensuring the success of our student-athletes in all of their endeavors — academically, athletically and socially," Bourne said. "Our goals are to win conference championships and to advance our teams to post-season play while adhering to NCAA and conference guidelines and to graduate our student-athletes.

"We continue to strengthen the infrastructure and facilities of the athletics program," he said. "Our support centers and athletics personnel are dedicated to providing student-athletes with the best experience possible at the intercollegiate level. We also are extremely pleased with the construction of the Robert

and Frances Plecker Athletic
Performance Center, which benefits
all of our student-athletes with
state-of-the-art academic facilities
and serves as an entrance and
focal point for our football stadium.
Other athletics facilities construction that is being planned and
implemented on campus – immediately new baseball and softball
stadiums and enhancement of our
football facility and later upgrades
for other programs – will provide
JMU with outstanding competition
sites."

The Plecker Performance Center, which opened in 2005, is the first significant facility project funded primarily through private resources in JMU athletics' history. The \$10 million facility is adjacent to Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field and features support areas for football and areas for entertaining during home football games and for JMU's athletic hall of fame. Also included is the Challace McMillin Academic Center that benefits performers in all JMU sports programs. Advising and counseling for all of JMU student-athletes take place at the facility, which also includes an outstanding computer lab and

strength training and sports medicine facilities.

Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field, the home of JMU's football program, has a large electronic score-board with live game action and video replay capabilities, an outstanding FieldTurf playing surface and an enhanced sound system added in recent years.

Prior to arriving at JMU in 1999, Bourne served in several athletics roles at Virginia Tech from 1986-97 and was senior associate athletics director at Georgia Tech from 1997-99. At Georgia Tech, he supervised finance, marketing and promotions, ticketing, sports information, and radio and television broadcasts and production. He also was liaison to the Alexander-Tharpe fund, the university's development arm, and administered baseball and golf.

At Virginia Tech, he was associate athletics director during his final two years, and he co-chaired a committee that reviewed gender equity at the school. The committee developed and implemented a plan that brought the school into compliance with federal guidelines and ranked it fifth nationally in compliance.

A Salem, Va., native, Bourne was Virginia Tech's athletics business manager and then associate athletics director for administration and finance.

Bourne received his Bridgewater College degree in business administration and accounting in 1981 and completed his master's degree in education and sports management at Virginia Tech in 1994. He worked for four years in public accounting and received his certification in public accountancy before moving to Virginia Tech, where he first was an internal auditor and a consultant to the athletic business office. He is a 1994 graduate of the Sports Management Institute Executive Program from the University of North Carolina and the University of Southern California.

Bourne's wife, the former Mary Lou Garber, is a Harrisonburg area native and a Bridgewater graduate. They have two sons -- Jason (20), a JMU student, and Kyle (17).

A record total of 114 teams – representing 15 collegiate athletic conferences and one independent – will compete in the three-day event (February 18-20), with the entire BracketBusters slate of matchups to be announced in late January. Drexel, James Madison, UNC Wilmington, Old Dominion, Towson and William & Mary will serve as host schools, while Delaware, George Mason, Georgia State, Hofstra, Northeastern and VCU will play on the road.

Of the 57 games, 11 will be televised, with six contests on ESPN2 and five games on ESPNU.

The CAA has had great success in BracketBusters, with the conference posting a 12-9 record in televised contests over the past six years. CAA teams have registered some of the most impressive victories in the event, highlighted by George Mason's triumph at Wichita State in 2006, Drexel beating Creighton on the road in 2007, VCU's victory at Akron in 2008 and Northeastern winning at Wright State in 2009.



Coming off the celebration of its 25th Anniversary in 2009-10, the Colonial Athletic Association has built a reputation as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences both athletically and academically.

The CAA encompasses five of the nation's nine largest metropolitan areas with a geographic footprint that stretches from Boston to Atlanta. The conference has produced 16 national team champions in five different sports, 33 individual national champions, 12 national players of the year, 12 national coaches of the year and 12 Honda Award winners. Just as impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 20 NCAA postgraduate scholars. In 2009-10, the CAA had more than 1,700 of the league's 4,000 student-athletes received the Commissioner's Academic Award after posting at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport. The conference had 28 teams in 15 different sports receive NCAA Public Recognition Awards based on the latest Academic Progress Report released in 2010.

The landscape of the conference stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes six of the nation's top 25 media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (7), Atlanta (8), Washington, D.C. (9) and Baltimore (25). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 20 million.

The CAA currently sponsors 23 sports with the addition of a football league in 2007 and women's rowing in 2009. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and wrestling. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. In 2009-10, 20 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths and 32 student-athletes received All-America honors.

The conference has made its presence known nationally in men's basketball with a league-record six teams advancing to postseason play in 2009-10. Conference champion Old Dominion made its third NCAA Tournament appearance in the last six years and knocked off Notre Dame in the first round. Northeastern and William and Mary received berths in the NIT. VCU posted five straight victories and captured the CBI championship. Hofstra also took part in the CBI and George Mason played in the CIT. In 2006, George Mason captured the nation's imagination by becoming the first mid-major program since 1979 to reach the Final Four, knocking off powerhouses Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and Connecticut along the way. The Patriots were ranked No. 8 in the final ESPN/ USA Today Top 25 poll, which was the highest ever for a CAA team.

A league-record seven CAA women's basketball teams advanced to postseason play in 2009-10. James Madison represented the conference in the **NCAA** Tournament after capturing its first CAA championship since 1989. Delaware, Drexel, Hofstra, Old Dominion and VCU participated in the WNIT, with VCU

advancing to the third round. Towson took part in the WBI. ODU, which won an NCAA-record 17 straight CAA titles from 1992-2008, boasts three national championships (1979, 1980, 1985) and was national runner-up in 1997.

The conference also excels in many other sports. CAA squads have combined to win 10 field hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981. Delaware and Towson have each reached the Final Four of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship. Three women's soccer teams have reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament in two of the past three seasons and at least one men's soccer team has advanced to the final 16 of the NCAA Championship in five of the last eight years. In men's cross country, William & Mary placed fifth nationally as a team in 2009 and had three runners earn All-America status. In the pool, George Mason's Ashley Danner finished as the runner-up in the 100 breaststroke at the 2010 NCAA Championship and received All-America honors along with Towson's Meredith Budner. The CAA has sent multiple teams to the NCAA Baseball Championship in nine of the last 13 years and has had at least 12 players selected in the last eight Major League Baseball drafts. The conference also boasts numerous All-Americans in tennis, golf, track and field, women's lacrosse and wrestling.

CAA member institutions are committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a

goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Among the programs already established are an undergraduate research conference, coordination of study abroad programs and granting visiting academic status to student-athletes traveling to an away contest so that they have access to libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs.

In 2002, two faculty members from CAA institutions were awarded

academia's most coveted distinction – the Nobel Prize. John B. Fenn, a research professor in the Department of Chemistry at Virginia Commonwealth University, received the Nobel Prize for chemistry, and Vernon Smith, a professor of economics and law at George Mason University, shared the Nobel Prize in economic sciences.

Commissioner Thomas E. Yeager has guided the CAA since its inception. The conference traces its roots back to 1983 when three of its current members-George Mason University, James Madison University, and the College of William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new association. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985.

Charter members George Mason, James Madison, UNC Wilmington and William and Mary were joined by Old Dominion University in 1991 and by Virginia Commonwealth University in 1995. The conference added the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference on July 1, 2005.

## KEY BASKETBALL DATES

#### Jan. 11, 1947

JMU beat Mary Washington 31-24 in its first game in the Reed Hall (now Keezell Hall) gymnasium. Men first attended JMU's regular session in the fall of 1946, and the players were mostly of World War II veterans. JMU played seven games in 1946-47.

#### Dec. 3, 1969

JMU played its first NCAA varsity game, losing 101-83 at Shepherd. The NCAA considers a program varsity when it plays only varsity teams.

#### Dec. 6, 1969


JMU beat D.C. Teacher's College 80-77 for its first NCAA win. The game was played at Harrisonburg High School, the site of JMU home games 1968-72 until Godwin Hall opened.

#### 1971-72

Major changes began as President Ronald E. Carrier brought in as athletics director Dean Ehlers, who was 16-7 in one season as head coach.

#### May 1972

Changes continued as Lou Campanelli became head coach, scholarships were first awarded and an on-campus facility was completed. Wilbert "Buddy" Mills signed JMU's first scholarship May 5; Godwin Hall (capacity 5,100) was dedicated May 6; and Campanelli was hired May 11.



Bryan Edwards was first-team All-CAA on JMU's 1992 and 1993 NIT teams.

#### Dec. 2, 1972

JMU beat Bridgewater 69-54 in its first game under Lou Campanelli and its first game in Godwin Hall, its home for 10 seasons.

#### Dec. 7, 1972

George Toliver became JMU's first 1,000-point scorer in an 81-44 win over Tusculum.

#### Dec. 12, 1973

JMU played a Division I foe for the first time, losing 58-54 at Virginia Military.

#### Feb. 25, 1974

JMU beat a Division I team for the first time, 43-41 at The Citadel, and clinched its first 20-win year.

#### March 6, 1974

JMU played in an NCAA Tournament for the first time, losing 59-54 at Fisk.

#### March 3, 1975

JMU won the Virginia College Athletic Association, 107-96 at home over St. Paul's, as Sherman Dillard scored 42 points. JMU had won the VCAA West crown with a 6-0 record.

#### March 11-12, 1976

JMU made its second NCAA appearance, losing 86-77 to Old Dominion and 86-81 to Morgan State.

#### Sept. 1, 1976

The NCAA approved JMU's move to Division I.

#### Sept. 21, 1977

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{JMU}}$  joined the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC).

#### Feb. 13, 1978

Sherman Dillard became the first Duke to score 2,000 points in a 71-70 home win over The Citadel.

#### June 9, 1978

Sherman Dillard, Indiana's sixth-round selection, became the first Duke selected in the National Basketball Association draft.

#### Jan. 27, 1979

Steve Stielper broke Sherman Dillard's JMU record of 2,065 points in a 52-49 win at William and Mary. Stielper had 2,126 career points.

#### March 6-7, 1981

JMU posted its first ECAC post-season wins and earned its first NCAA Division I Tournament bid. The Dukes beat William and Mary 44-42 and Richmond 69-60 at Hampton, Va.

#### March 12-14, 1981

JMU made its first Division I NCAA appearance, beating Georgetown 61-55 at Providence, R.I., in the East Regional. Two days later JMU appeared on national television (NBC) for the first time but lost 54-45 to Notre Dame.

#### Feb. 22, 1982

JMU beat Campbell 79-46 in the final game at Godwin Hall, where JMU had a 119-22 (.844) record.

#### March 11-13, 1982

JMU made its second straight NCAA appearance and beat Ohio State 55-48 in Charlotte, N.C. Eventual NCAA champion North Carolina ended JMU's season 52-50 in the second round.



#### Nov. 28, 1982


JMU beat Virginia Military 58-33 in the first game in the JMU Convocation Center. JMU's Charles Fisher scored the first points in the facility.

#### March 12, 1983


JMU won its second ECAC South title, beating William and Mary 41-38 in the tournament finals at the University of Richmond and gaining its third straight NCAA bid.

#### March 17-19, 1983

JMU beat West Virginia 57-50 in Greensboro, N.C., to win an NCAA first-round game for the third straight year. North Carolina ended JMU's season for the second straight year 68-49.

John Thurston, a 10-year JMU assistant under Lou Campanelli, became JMU's coach. Campanelli became the coach at California.

#### June 6, 1985

The eight members of the ECAC South formed the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA).

#### March 14, 1987

JMU lost 70-63 at Stephen F. Austin in its first National Invitation Tournament game. JMU was 20-10 after being 5-23 in 1985-86 and was the most-improved team in the nation.

#### **April 6, 1988**

Charles "Lefty" Driesell became JMU's coach, succeeding Tom McCorry, who coached 11 games after John Thurston resigned Jan. 29.

#### March 15, 1990

JMU lost 78-74 to New Orleans in the first round of the NIT in the first men's post-season contest (nonconference) at the JMU Convocation Center.

#### March 13, 1991

JMU lost 98-93 in double overtime at Providence in the first round of the NIT in a nationally televised (ESPN) game.

#### March 20, 1992

JMU made its third straight NIT appearance, losing 73-69 at Rutgers.

#### March 18, 1993

JMU played in the NIT for the fourth straight year, losing 73-61 at Providence.

Steve Stielper had team records of March 5-7, 2,126 points and 917 rebounds in four JMU seasons.

JMU won its first CAA Tournament, beating American 86-67, UNC Wilmington 91-78 and Old Dominion 77-76.

#### March 17, 1994

Final Four participant Florida beat JMU 64-62 in the NCAA East Regional's first round in Uniondale, N.Y.

#### March 20, 1997

Sherman Dillard, an All-America player and an academic All-American at JMU, was named the program's head coach, becoming the first former JMU player to lead the Dukes.

#### April 1, 2004


Dean Keener became JMU's coach, replacing Sherman Dillard, who resigned March 7. Keener was introduced at an April 7 press conference.

#### March 25,2008

Matt Brady became JMU's coach, replacing Dean Keener, who resigned Feb. 22, effective at the end of the season. Brady was introduced at March 26 press conference.

#### 2008-09

JMU reached the semifinals of the inaugural CollegeInsider.com Tournament and compiled a 21-15 record during Coach Matt Brady's first season with the Dukes.




Darren McLinton set a then JMU Convocation Center record with nine three-point field goals against Virginia Commonwealth in 1995-96







### JMU Basketball Started During 1946-47 Season

There were no athletic scholarships, no conference affiliation and no modern, on-campus playing facility, but there was men's basketball at JMU well before the sport's NCAA-recognized start in 1969-70.

Men's basketball was first played at then-Madison College in 1946-47 when a group of the campus' first male students played seven games. Men, although not housed on campus, first attended JMU's regular session in 1946-47, and the first Dukes' team consisted mostly of World War II veterans. The nickname "Dukes" honored university president Dr. Samuel P. Duke, who assisted in initiating the team.

JMU didn't play a schedule of all college varsity teams until 1969-70; therefore, its early squads aren't recognized as NCAA "varsity." Some college varsity teams were included before 1969-70, but JMU also played junior varsity, military installation and prep school teams.

Scheduling changes began when JMU became fully co-educational in 1966-67, expanding the pool of potential players beyond those previously attending only as day students.

The student newspaper, The Breeze, in the early 1960s at times referred to the team as the "extramural" men's basketball team, and some players on the intercollegiate squad also appeared in reports on intramural play.

The Breeze in March 1965 called that season's JMU squad its "beat team ever fielded" and reported a school-record 37-point effort by Charlie Phillips in a 117-59 win over Monroe Business College. The same article reported that Jerry Walters had a team-record 147 points that season.


JMU's early teams played home games in a gymnasium in what is now Keezell Hall, sharing space with other intercollegiate teams, academic activities and intramurals. A 1960s Breeze article refers to the team being allowed only several hours per week for practice. The team played home games at Harrisonburg High School from 1967-68 until Godwin Hall opened in 1972-73.

The city newspaper, the Harrisonburg Daily News-Record, in a 1967-68 preview referred to JMU's "embryonic" basketball team taking "a giant step forward" and a 1968-69 preview speaks of a "second season of serious intercollegiate basketball" and ushering in "advanced competition."

The 1967-68 team finished 6-10 and included junior college transfers Bob Hummer and Butch Rinker, who played key roles in the program's transition. Hummer reached double figures in scoring in each 1967-68 game and finished the year with 281 points. Rinker had 161 points, including two 33-point efforts, in nine games.

Freshman Steve Misenheimer arrived in 1968-69 and twice that season broke the team scoring record. He had 415 points overall (18.9 average) as JMU finished 13-9, and he had 38 points Jan. 11 in an 85-78 home win over Bluefield Junior College and 43 in 104-85 home win over Shenandoah Feb. 19. Hummer in 1968-69 averaged 15.7 points and had a 28-point, 29-rebound effort in a 96-80 win at Shenandoah. He also had 28 points in a 103-68 win over George Mason, and Rinker averaged nearly 14 points that season.

J. Ward Long, a long-time JMU physical education instructor, coached the JMU team for much of its early existence, and Phil Huntsinger led the Dukes in 1967-68 and 1968-69. JMU's baseball field is named for Long, and Huntsinger coached the JMU baseball team in 1970.

## POSTSEASON PLAY

## **Dukes Receive Two NCAA Division II Bids**

JMU played in the NCAA Division II Tournament in 1974 and 1976 under Coach Lou Campanelli before moving to Division I for the 1976-77 season. In the program's second year with scholarship players the 1973-74 Dukes were 20-4 in the regular season and 20-6 overall. In 1975-76 they were 18-7 in the regular season and 18-9 overall and beat Division I foes Virginia Military (final eight in the Division I Tournament) and East Tennessee State. Current JMU Coach Sherman Dillard led both teams in scoring, averaging 21.0 points per game as a 1973-74 freshman and 22.4 points per game in 1975-76. The 1973-74 team ranked fifth nationally in scoring defense, and the 1975-76 squad was nationally ranked for the much of the season.

## NCAA Division I Bids in Three Straight Seasons

JMU advanced to the NCAA Division I Tournament three straight times by winning the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) South Tournament in 1980-81 and 1982-83 and by receiving an at-large bid after a 22-4 regular season in 1981-82 when it won the ECAC South regular-season crown. Under Coach Lou Campanelli, the Dukes won their first-round game and then played on national television against a well-recognized opponent in the second round each season. The 1981-82 team met North Carolina in the second round and battled into the closing seconds against the eventual national championship team that included future first-round professional draft selections in Michael Jordan. James Worthy and Sam Perkins. The trio of Dan Ruland, Charles Fisher and David Dupont formed the nucleus of the three teams while Linton Townes was the ECAC South player of the year in 1981-82. JMU allowed 57.2 points per game in 1980-81, 52.0 in 1981-82 and 53.9 in 1982-83 and was among the national leaders in scoring defense each season.


#### **Return to NCAA Play**

Coach "Lefty" Driesell led JMU back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 11 seasons in 1993-94 when the Dukes won the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament for the first time. JMU overcame a 19-point deficit in the final 13:04 of the championship game against Old Dominion and won 77-76 on Kent Culuko's three-point field goal at the final horn. JMU battled eventual Final Four participant Florida into the closing seconds before losing its NCAA opener 64-62. Clayton Ritter averaged 18.3 points and 7.4 rebounds per game and shot 62.8 percent from the field for the season, and he had 27 points in 25 minutes in NCAA play.



## HALL OF FAME



Among the JMU Athletics Hall of Fame inductees are nine former players or coaches in the Dukes' program. The Hall of Fame's first class was inducted in 1988.

#### 1989



**Sherman Dillard** (1973-78) was one of the leading student-athletes in JMU history, earning All-America honors as a player and academic All-America recognition. He led the team in scoring during each of his four seasons and is the No. 2 scorer overall

in program history (2,065). He was a 52.1 percent career shooter as a perimeter performer, and he coached the Dukes from 1997-2004. He was a member of NCAA Tournament teams in 1974 and 1976.

#### 1991

#### **George Toliver**

(1969-73) scored 1,287 career points and was JMU's first 1,000-point scorer while playing during the program's first four official NCAA varsity seasons. He later was a basketball game official at the college and National Basketball Association levels.


Pat Dosh (1974-78) was a member of NCAA Tournament teams in 1974 and 1976, and he remains the JMU program's No. 2 career rebounder (821) and No. 6 career scorer (1,458). He is third in team history in free throws made (366) and tied for

ninth in assists (274), and he played much of his career with JMU's top two all-time scorers.

#### 1998

#### **Linton Townes**

(1978-82) was the top scorer on JMU's first two Division I NCAA Tournament teams (1981, 1982), and he was the 1982 Eastern College **Athletic Conference** (ECAC) South Player of the Year. He is the program's No. 7 career



scorer (1,380) and is its career shooting percentage leader among perimeter players (.557).

#### 1999



Lou Campanelli (1972-85) coached the Dukes for 13 seasons, compiling a 238-118 (.669) record and leading them to NCAA Tournament appearances in 1974, 1976, 1981, 1982 and 1983. JMU won a first-round NCAA game for three straight

seasons from 1981-83, and he was the 1982 Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) South Coach of the Year.

#### 2000

Dan Ruland (1979-83) was a key member of each of JMU's first three Division I NCAA Tournament teams (1981-83), and he was Co-Player of the Year in the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) South as a 1982-83 senior. He had 1,255

points and 640 rebounds, the No. 6 mark among JMU players, and he led the team in scoring in 1982-83 and in rebounding in 1981-82 and 1982-83.





Steve Stielper (1976-80) joined the JMU program for its first Division I season (1976-77), and he remains the Dukes' career scoring (2,126) and rebounding leader (917). He set the team season scoring average record (25.7) as a junior in 1978-79, and he was

the team's top rebounder during each of his four JMU seasons and its No. 1 season scorer three times.

#### 2005

#### "Lefty" Driesell (1988-97) coached JMU for nine seasons and led the Dukes to five postseason appearances, including to the 1994 NCAA Tournament after they won the CAA title. He compiled a 159-111 (.589) record, and his





**Steve Hood** (1989-91) was CAA Player of the Year and scoring leader during each of his JMU seasons (1989-90 and 1990-91). He averaged 22.0 points per game in 1989-90 and 20.7 in 1990-91 for JMU squads that had the CAA's best regular-season

record and played in the National Invitation Tournament. He had 1,282 points in two JMU seasons, and his 21.4-point career scoring average and 46.4 percent (122-263) career three-point shooting mark are JMU records.

#### 2008

**Gary Butler** (1969-72) was a top JMU player from 1969-72 before missing all but a part of one game of his senior season (knee injury). He had 870 points and 682 rebounds, led JMU in rebounding for three years and in scoring once, and was a two-year captain



and a team MVP. His 12.3 game rebounds average for 1969-70 and his 11.2 career mark are JMU records.
